Ohki Siminé Forest is Canadian Mohawk and was initiated into the Iroquois Wolf Clan, and trained by Maya and Mongolian Shamans. She is a wisdom maker who teaches spiritual warriorship through ancient Medicine Wheel ways. She is author of *"Dreaming the Council Ways: True native teachings from the Red Lodge"* and a contributor to *"Original Instructions: Indigenous teachings for a Sustainable Future."* In recent years Ohki has presented at Esalen Institute, Bioneers, Vedanta Centre, Unitarian Churches and Tesuque Indigenous conference where her humility and deep knowledge of Earth Ways have brought inspiration to thousands.
